This act was not designed to raise revenue but it was part of England's mercantile policy of the time and a continuation of the Navigation Acts. The Molasses Act of 1733, (also sometimes referred to as the Sugar Act of 1733) was one of the later laws directed against colonial trade that.

Enacted by Parliament on December 25, 1733, the act imposed duties and shipping restrictions on sugar and molasses imported into the North.
